PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

PUBLIC COMMENTS: This is an opportunity for members of the public to address the Council on subjects within its jurisdiction, whether or not on the agenda for this meeting. The Council has the right to reasonably limit the length of individual comments. Pursuant to Yreka Municipal Code Section 1.24.170 those addressing the Council shall limit their remarks to five minutes. For items, which are on this agenda, speakers may request that their comments be heard instead at the time the item is to be acted upon by the Council. The Council may ask questions, but may take no action during the Public Comment portion of the meeting, except to direct staff to prepare a report, or to place an item on a future agenda.

SPEAKERS: Please speak from the podium. State your name and mailing address so that City Staff can respond to you in regard to your comments, or provide you with information, if appropriate. You are not required to state your name and address if you do not desire to do so.

1. Discussion/Possible Action - Consent Calendar: All matters listed under the consent calendar are considered routine and will be enacted by one motion unless any member of the Council wishes to remove an item for discussion or a member of the audience wishes to comment on an item. The City Manager recommends approval of the following consent calendar items:
 - a. Approval of Minutes of the meeting held May 5, 2011.
 - b. Approval of Warrants issued from May 6 through May 19, 2011.
 - c. Approval of Treasurer's Report and budget to actual for the month of April 2011.
 - d. Adopt Resolution No. 2913 approving requests associated with the Chamber of Commerce event known as Gold Rush Days.

2. Public Hearing – Draft Urban Water Management Plan:
As part of the public hearing on the Draft Update, the City of Yreka is conducting this public hearing to: (1) adopt a method, pursuant to California Water Code (CWC) § 10608.20, for determining its urban water use target in 2020, (2) allow community input regarding its plan for achieving the water conservation provisions of its Draft Update, and (3) consider the economic impacts of its implementation plan for achieving its 2020 urban water use target.

3. Discussion/Possible Action – Introduction of Ordinance No. 824 repealing Ordinances 41, 59, 91, 523, 672, and amending certain sections of Title 9, Chapter 9.48 miscellaneous offenses and Title 8 Chapter 8.12

5. Reconsideration of May 5, 2011 Action (requested by Councilmember Foster): Discussion/Possible Direction to Staff – Prepare a Resolution authorizing the submission of an application for funding from the Planning and Technical Assistance Allocation of the State Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) Program.
- Discussion/Possible Action – Adopt Resolution No. 2915 approving an application for funding, and the execution of a Grant Agreement and any amendments thereto from the Planning and Technical Assistance (P/TA) Economic Development Allocation of the State CDBG Program.
