

City of Yreka

The City is 9.97 square miles in size with an approximate population of 7,500 citizens. Yreka has a clean environment, open spaces and rural atmosphere. Yreka is located 22 miles south of the Oregon border just off Interstate 5, in Siskiyou County.

The Department

The Yreka Police Department is staffed with fifteen (15) sworn personnel. The Police Department offers additional

assignments in Detectives, Field Training Officer and Narcotics Task Force. The patrol staff works a 4-10 schedule.



Typical Duties

Operate a radio equipped patrol vehicle, call response, crime deterrence, public information and assistance, traffic and crowd control, and incident investigation; apprehend and arrest suspects; interview witnesses; collect and preserve crime scene evidence, prepare reports and records, administer first aid; perform subpoena and warrant service; other related duties as required.

Minimum Qualifications

Must be a United States citizen or meet the requirements of Government Code 1031; must be 21 years of age or older; possess a high school diploma or GED; be a successful graduate from a POST certified academy; be in possession of a current and valid California Driver's License issued by the Department of Motor Vehicles.

Examination Procedure

Lateral applicants must successfully pass an oral board exam, physical agility test and Chief's interview.

Medical Examination

Qualifying medical standard exam with vision requirement of 20/100 or better without correction and 20/40 or better with correction in each eye.
