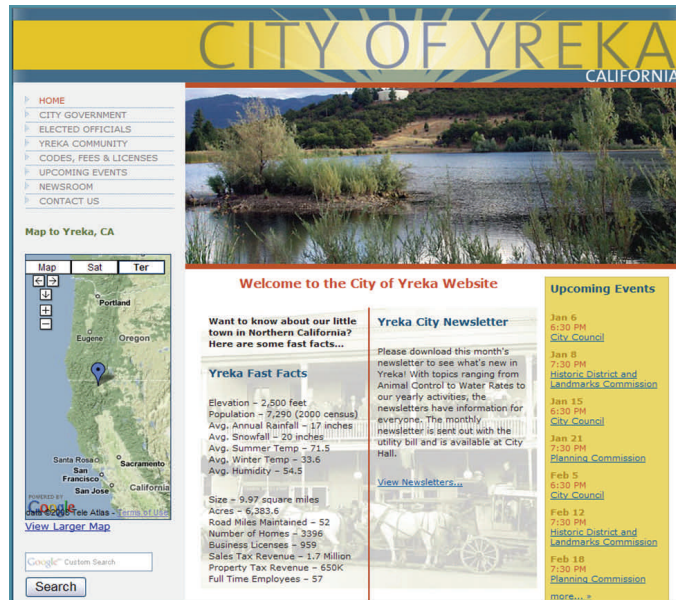
## The City of Yreka's First Website

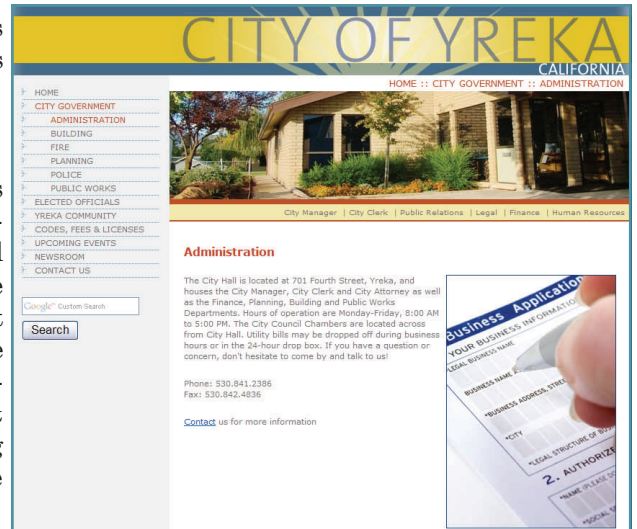

## CODES, FEES & LICENSES

City permit and license applications are also available for download as PDF files and information is included with each application.

## UPCOMING EVENTS

The calendar will provide information concerning a wide variety of community events while at the same time providing access to regularly scheduled City meetings and their respective minutes. ## REMINDER

The enclosed bill reflects the annual cost of living factor of 7% for the FIRE TAX assessment. Single-family residents will see an increase of 35 cents on the monthly utility bill (reference description line FIRE TAX). Multi-family residential and commercial accounts have various FIRE TAX increases as stated by the November 2006 Ballot Measure H.
