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**MINUTES OF THE REGULAR MEETING OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE  
CITY OF YREKA HELD IN SAID CITY ON AUGUST 3, 2021**

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On the 3<sup>rd</sup> day of August 2021, the City Council of the City of Yreka met in regular session, and upon roll call, the following were present: Deborah Baird, Joan Smith Freeman, Duane Kegg, and Corey Middleton, Paul McCoy.

**5. CONSENT AGENDA:**

Mayor Kegg announced that all matters listed under the consent calendar are considered routine and will be enacted by one motion unless any member of the Council wishes to remove an item for discussion, or a member of the audience wishes to comment on an item:

The City Manager recommended approval of the following consent items:

- a. Approval/ratification of payments issued from July 12, 2021, through July 25, 2021.
- b. Approval of Minutes of the regular meeting held July 20, 2021.
- c. Approval of Minutes of the special meeting held July 27, 2021.
- d. Continuation of Urgency Ordinance #855: Covid-19
- e. Continuation of Urgency Ordinance #864: Fireworks
- f. Waive Full Text Reading of All Ordinances on the Agenda. Ordinances shall be introduced and adopted by title only.

Councilmember McCoy pulled item #5b for discussion.

Councilmember Baird moved to approve items #5a, #5c, #5d, #5e, and #5f as presented.

Councilmember Middleton seconded the motion, and upon roll call, the following voted AYE: Baird, Freeman, McCoy, Middleton, and Kegg.

Mayor Kegg thereupon declared the motion carried.

Mayor Kegg directed the City Manager to bring the minutes of the regular meeting held on July 20, 2021 back to Council at the next meeting, with the consensus of the Council.

**7. OLD BUSINESS:**

**a. Discussion/Possible Action – Shopping Cart Ordinance**

Presentation of Ordinance to amend Yreka Municipal Code Title 5, by adding to Title 5 and Enacting Chapter 5.25 Pertaining to Shopping Cart Control, and Finding that the Ordinance is Exempt from CEQA.

Mayor Kegg directed the City Manager to work with the City Attorney to revise the shopping cart ordinance and bring it back at a future meeting.

**8. NEW BUSINESS:**

**a. Discussion/Possible Action – Siskiyou Scenic Bicycle Tour**

Adopt a Resolution Approving Requests Associated with the Special Event Known as the Siskiyou Scenic Bicycle Tour to be held on the dates of Friday, May 6, 2022, and Saturday, May 7, 2022.

Following Council discussion, Councilmember McCoy moved to approve item #8a.

Councilmember Freeman seconded the motion, and upon roll call, the following voted AYE: Baird, Freeman, Middleton, McCoy, and Kegg.

Mayor Kegg thereupon declared the motion carried.

**b. Discussion/Possible Action – Yreka Union High School Cross County Meets**

Adopt a Resolution Approving Requests Associated with the Special Events Known as the Yreka Union High School Cross Country Meets.

Following Council discussion, Councilmember Middleton moved to approve item #8b.

Councilmember Freeman seconded the motion, and upon roll call, the following voted AYE: Baird, Freeman, Middleton, McCoy, and Kegg.

Mayor Kegg thereupon declared the motion carried.

**c. Discussion/Possible Action – Chipseal Work**

Authorize the Mayor to Sign the Memorandum of Agreement with the Karuk Tribe to Share Chipseal Project Work and Costs on City Streets.

Following Council discussion, Councilmember McCoy moved to approve item #8c.

Councilmember Baird seconded the motion, and upon roll call, the following voted AYE: Baird, Freeman, Middleton, McCoy, and Kegg.

Mayor Kegg thereupon declared the motion carried.

**d. Discussion/Possible Action – Police Chief Recruitment**

Request authorization for Interim City Manager to execute agreement for recruitment of Police Chief.

Mayor Kegg directed the City Manager to move forward with recruitment of Police Chief with the consensus of the Council.

**e. Discussion/Possible Action – City Hall Hours**

Rescind prior City Council direction to close City Hall for public access on Fridays.


According to the City Attorney, no motion was needed due to a sunset date of September 5, 2014.


Mayor Kegg directed the City Manager to open City Hall for access to the public from 8 am to 5 pm, Monday through Friday with the consensus of the Council.
