YREKA PAVEMENT REHAB PROJECT

The California Department of Transportation (Caltrans), with the Federal Highway Administration (FHWA), is performing a roadway rehabilitation project on State Route (SR 3) in the City of Yreka. The project is approximately 4.4 miles in length and is designed to rehabilitate the existing pavement to current design standards, increase the service life of the roadway, improve rideability, and improve safety for pedestrians, bicyclists, and motorists. Construction will start approximately June 2022 and end in Fall 2024.

State Route 3 will be entirely rehabilitated. This includes long-life pavement construction, storm drain replacement, two pedestrian signals, sidewalks and ADA ramps, approximately 90 curb ramps and 190 driveways, and utilities (such as light poles and manhole covers) relocated.

In addition, the project includes designated bike lanes, County transit stops with signage, pavement markings, improved crosswalks, and upgrading bridge rails. The City of Yreka is currently replacing and upgrading the 7200 feet of sewer, and 15,000 feet of water infrastructure. Totalling nearly 10 million dollars of upgrades prior to paving. A 2 million dollar beautification project has been proposed by the State. Funded by the Clean California grant program, these upgrades would be maintained by Yreka Public Works.



MAIN STREET WATER IMPROVEMENT PROJECT

Due to supply chain issues this project encountered a delayed start. Work is now underway. The project will start on the north end of town near Casa Ramos and head south. Stay tuned for additional information regarding traffic detours.

The upcoming Main Street Water System Improvements Project involves relocating and upgrading approximately 11,000 feet of water main and 4,000 feet of water laterals within the Main Street right-of-way. It will also relocate over a hundred new water meters, new meter boxes, and a water sampling station.


A \$3.5M Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) for construction has been executed to help fund the project.

Council approved the City application for the grant in February 2020 and committed to providing necessary match funds from the Water Enterprise fund.



Water Supply and Storage Improvements Project (Not on Main Street!)

Yet another sizeable upgrade is coming! Tentative construction start date - April 2023. Council recently adopted a resolution accepting a Drinking Water State Revolving Funds (DWSRF) Grant in the Amount of \$4,939,000. This project involves installing a new well, replacing four undersized storage tanks with two new tanks to increase storage capacity by about 700,000 gallons, improvements to the Outsen booster pump station, installation of approximately 2600 feet of water main, and electrical/SCADA improvements at the City water treatment plant. City Engineer PACE Engineering has estimated the full construction project, including additional design and administration services, to cost approximately \$5,220,000. The estimated cost of the full construction project exceeds the grant by approximately \$280,000, which would be City match paid for by Water Reserves.



E. Lennox Street Water Line Replacement and WTP Filter Improvements Project

Separate from the previous two projects, these upgrades have been in the works for a number of years. Thanks to the hard work of City Staff and our City Engineers at PACE, Yreka is set for the busiest construction period on record.

This project involves constructing approximately 2,050 feet of 16-inch water main, crossing under Interstate-5 and railroad tracks. A bridge crossing with casing and carrier pipe, water service lines, fire hydrants, and Water Treatment Plant filter improvements. The construction is funded by a Drinking Water State Revolving Fund (DWSRF) construction grant in the amount of \$3,135,000. There is no City funding match required.
